Role Descriptor for the Scottish Representative of AULC

AULC is run by an Executive Committee as detailed in the Constitution approved at the AGM in 2019 and updated and approved at an extraordinary AGM vote in 2025. This role profile should be read in conjunction with the Constitution available to download from:

The Executive Committee is made up of

- Attainment Lead
- Outreach Lead
- Scholarship Lead
- Social Media Lead
- Scotland Representative
- Wales Representative
- Teaching Representative
- Teaching Representative
- UCFL Representative (co-opted)
- Annual conference organiser (co-opted for one year)

The **Scotland Representative of AULC** is responsible for:

- a. liaising with member universities in Scotland;
- b. establish effective communication with all universities in Scotland;
- c. liaising with Webmaster to post information pertaining to languages in Scotland;
- d. advising the Executive Committee on matters pertaining to languages in Scotland;
- e. promote the benefits of membership of AULC and CercleS by ensuring active engagement with partner universities in Scotland;
- f. advising the Executive Committee on the advancement of the Scottish Gaelic language;
- g. facilitating the sharing of best practice in language learning and teaching in Scotland and the rest of the UK;
- h. foster inter-regional links.

The Scotland Representative of AULC shall be elected for three years, and may be elected for a further year, after which further nominations will be sought. No AULC member may serve

on Executive Committee in the same role for more than a total of eight consecutive years. Terms of office will begin at the date specified in the advertisement.
