Role Descriptor for the AULC Attainment Lead

The Executive Committee is made up of

- Annual conference organiser (co-opted for one year)

The **AULC Attainment Lead** is responsible for:

- a. Co-leading a SIG on Assessment and CEFR benchmarking
- b. advising the AULC Executive Committee on matters pertaining to standards and attainment initiatives
- c. Redeveloping an AULC standards and attainment framework and network to replace UNILANG (in part to reflect the 2019 CEFR Companion Volume)
- d. Being a member of the NULTE network SIG from CERCLES and ensuring AULC alignment with and dissemination of NULTE practices
- e. Being a member of the API Forum (Action oriented Plurilingual Language Education) and disseminating information about webinars and conferences they organise
- f. Engaging with member institutions to make sure that they have access to support and guidance in matters related to CEFR attainment benchmarks and related teaching and assessment methodologies.

The AULC Attainment Lead shall be elected for three years, and may be elected for a further year, after which further nominations will be sought. No AULC member may serve on

Executive Committee in the same role for more than a total of eight consecutive years. Terms of office will begin at the date specified in the advertisement.
