We welcome contributions showcasing scholarship, innovation and effective practice in language teaching, learning, assessment, curriculum design, professional development and community engagement.

Proposals may address, but are not limited to, the following conference strands:

- **Research-Informed Teaching, Learning and Assessment**

We invite proposals for:

- **Individual Presentations:** 15-minute presentations followed by 10 minutes for questions and discussion
- **Panel Discussions:** 90-minute panels consisting of 4-5 presenters
- **Workshops:** 60-minute interactive sessions focusing on practical applications or teaching demonstrations

Presentations can be delivered in English, BSL/ISL or other languages provided that AULC's plurilingual presentations guidelines are followed. Presentations for AULC SIGs are welcome.

Please note that all presenters, including co-authors listed in accepted submissions, are required to register for the conference and pay the applicable registration fee.

Please submit an abstract in English (300 words) describing your proposed presentation, panel, or workshop, including the following information:

- Title of your paper or workshop
- A brief description of the content, objectives and methodology of the proposal
- A statement on how your work connects to the conference themes
- The language of delivery

You will also be requested to submit a short biography (150 words) of the presenter(s).
